RABBI'S MESSAGE

Together with the Seder Plate and stack of Matzot, it is the "Four Cups of Wine" that define for us our image of the Seder table. Aside from their usual ritual function of sanctification, these four cups of the Seder night(s) symbolize freedom, and the number four was likely chosen to correspond to the "four expressions of redemption" that appear in the Torah in the context of the exodus story. The Talmud (Pesachim 108a) tells us that women, though often exempt from *mitzvot aseih she-hazeman gemara* - time-bound positive commandments, are obligated in these four cups because "*af hen hayu be-oto ha-nes* - they too were part of the miracle [of Passover]." Tosafot, based on the Jerusalem Talmud, explain that women – like the men – were redeemed, i.e. they too experienced the exodus from Egypt. However, Rashi – and in turn his grandson Rashbam – argue that the women were not merely passive participants but had a more active role in this process, as the salvation was by virtue of the *nashim tzidkaniyot she-be-oto ha-dor*, the righteous women of that generation. In other words, depending on whether one adopts the position of Tosafot or of Rashi, the four cups celebrate either the *beneficiaries* of a miracle or its *benefactors*.

The upcoming holiday of Pesach is a beautiful one, bringing together families and friends for what Rav Joseph Soloveitchik z"l dubbed, "an exalted evening". For us here at Young Israel of New Hyde Park, however, these are particularly special times of which we can be proud. Over the course of two months, we have hosted the Tri-Community Blood Drive, a Metro NY Mikvah Seminar, a communal Purim Seuda, and the completion of Tractate Shabbat in the Daf Yomi cycle, and soon will be hosting a Yom Hashoah program and the long-awaited dedication ceremony of Mikveh Yisrael of New Hyde Park, will be represented at the Orthodox Union's Community Fair in Manhattan, and rejoice together at our annual journal dinner on Lag ba'Omer as we pay tribute to honorees Sharon and Moshe Zucker and Miriam and Yochanan Donath.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the "benefactors" of these past and upcoming events and achievements – our President David Rouhani and all the committee chairs and members who have exerted time and energy, creativity and talent, in organizing them, and those who have provided financial support for these programs. We must all also celebrate as "beneficiaries", those who gain from these efforts to strengthen our own synagogue and community, and enhance the level of Torah, Mitzvot, and Chesed. In that sense, *af anu be-oto ha-nes*, we will all be participants in raising the "banner" (another meaning of the Hebrew word *nes*) of Young Israel of New Hyde Park.

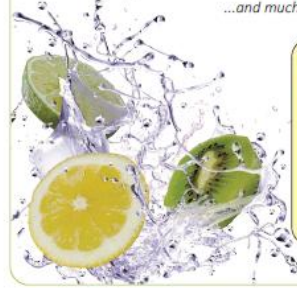
